# **Activities**

Despite the pandemic, that marked the first half of 2022, INS managed to organize a number of successful offline and online activities in Indonesia and the Netherlands.

### 1) Indonesia Nederland Society Innovation Program (INSIP 2022)

On Saturdays from 3 September 2022 to 22 October 2022, the INS organized a two-month online program, the Indonesia Nederland Society Innovation Program (INSIP 2022). The programme's goal was to let Indonesia's and the Netherlands' young generation develop solutions for sustainability challenges in renewable energy, digital technology, food and agriculture, and circular economy.

Out of 135 applications, 24 participants were selected, who were divided into six groups. Participants learned from industry leaders, venture capitalists, and start-up founders about market segmentation, customer value proposition, finance, key value drivers, climate impact, life-cycle assessment (LCA), and other topics to help participants transform their ideas into presentations and pitch them at the end of the program.

The Winning Team, Calcify, was awarded a one-week validation and networking trip to the Netherlands and Indonesia that will take place in 2023. Calcify is on a mission to transform the limestone industry by offering a sustainable and biodegradable alternative to bone-based calcium oxide. #### 2) A meeting of minds at Stoephout

The history of the Netherlands and Indonesia since 1900 shows us examples of 'a meeting of minds' of Indonesian and Dutch men and women that would finally have lasting impacts on our good relations with one another, privately and as countries. On 11 May Indonesia Nederland Society organized a meeting on this theme in the Stoephout apartment complex in Wassengar.



Ambassador Mayerfas, photographer/writer Suzanne Liem and former Minister Ben Bot shared their most inspirational narratives, models and historical moments with the audience. A <u>full report</u> can be read at the INS website.

### 3) The beating heart of Sophiahof

In October 2022, Andhika Rutten and Monica Bouman, board members of the Indonesia Nederland Society (INS) had a conversation with Yvonne van Genugten (director Indisch Herinneringscentrum), and Henry Timisela (director Moluks Historisch Museum). An estimated 2 million people in the Netherlands are connected to Indonesia and the Indonesian archipelago through their family histories. What are the colonial and postcolonial narratives that may be meaningful for representatives of this group and to others? Since February 2022, a semi-permanent exhibition 'Ons Land' has been set up in National Museum Sophiahof in The Hague. 'The exhibition is a co-production of the Indisch Herinneringscentrum and Museum Maluku / Moluks Historisch Museum. For a full report check the INS website.





#### 4) B20 dinner at the residence

In 2022 Indonesia presided over 2022 G20 summit and also hosted the B20 summit, organized by KADIN, Indonesia's Chamber of Commerce and Industry. In preparation for the B20 summit, the Chair of KADIN and his delegation visited the Netherlands to further strengthen the bilateral business relations and to invite Dutch companies to attend the B20 summit that was held on Bali 13-14 November 2022.

On 27 May 2022, the Indonesia Nederland Society co-hosted a dinner for more than 30 people at the residence of Indonesian Ambassador Mayerfas to provide an opportunity for informal discussions between the KADIN delegation, and representatives from the corporate sector and from government. Opening remarks were given by Ambassador Mayerfas and INS chairman Ed Kronenburg.





### 5) 'Indonesia's New Capital', Design thinking in the classroom

After the former successful Climate Village for Malino project in 2021 – also coordinated by INS - the Herenwegschool and Sekolah Indonesia SIDH in 2022 started a new project, running September/October, with Minecraft as tool for collaborative learning.



The

students (aged 11-14) had the assignment to make a design for a new capital of Indonesia. They met with the ambassador of Indonesia, the president of the Dutch

Senate, the mayor of Wassenaar, a landscape architect and a water engineer of IDN Liveable Cities. Under supervision of their teachers the students collaborated in task groups for Infrastructure & Transportation; Community; Vegetation; Clean Water Management; Health Care; Clean Air; Food Security.

The final result of this collaboration was a model of Indonesia's new capital designed in Minecraft. Hosted by the Indonesian Embassy a presentation of this model by six students of both schools became part of the Indonesia Now program on 1 December in Amsterdam.

In the summer of 2022, a bilateral meeting between INS board members of Indonesia and the Netherlands took place, on the occasion of the visit of Amir Amirruddin, the chair from INS Indonesia. It proved to be a great opportunity to update both sides on current events, plans and ambitions.
